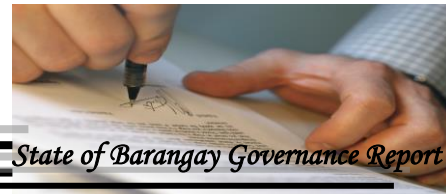

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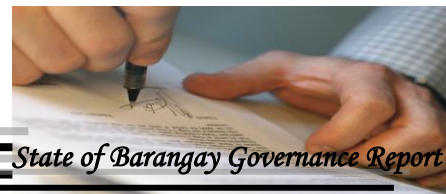

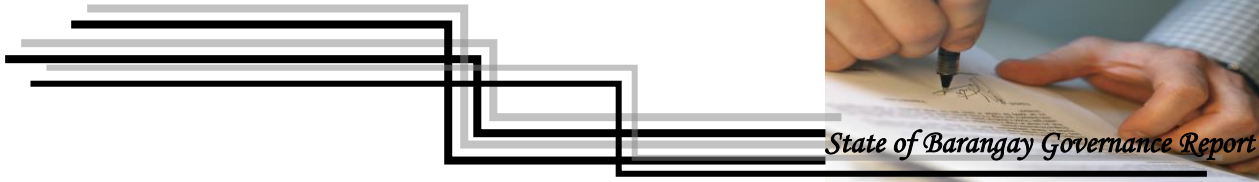

## *Brief History of the Barangay*

The name of the Barangay Dibibi is of unknown origin, however, there is an old folk song passed verbally from generation to generation.

During the pioneering of this thick forest mountain of our brother Bugkalots, a group of American Missionaries ventured the place and they met a mother carrying her baby. The American asked the mother about the name of the place. But since the mother could not understand their language, she just kept on communicating through sign language that made the baby awake and started crying. The baby got the attention of the American uttering "oh, the baby is crying". The American Missionaries put this experience in their diaries and called the place "The Baby". The name Dibibi has a spelling evolution from Dabibi, then Debibi and, at present, Dibibi.

Barangay Dibibi was officially created on March 7, 1964 by virtue of Resolution No. 26 -S- 1964 of the Municipal Council of Diffun, Nueva Vizcaya. This is a response to the petition of settlers dated March 7, 1964 headed by Barrio Captain Alfredo Bencio to former President Diosdado Macapagal through the Commission on National Integration (NCI) headed by Leonardo B. Perez, former Assemblyman of Nueva Vizcaya by that time, the settlers declared their farm lots in the Municipal Assessor's Office of Diffun, Nueva Vizcaya.

In 1965, the Municipality of Aglipay filed the Resolution No. 17 dated August 5, 1965 to the Province of Nueva Vizcaya claiming the Barrio Dibibi as their territory and Jurisdiction. The Petition was successfully accomplished through the effort of Mayor Jose B. Aquino.

June 21, 1968, the Republic Act 5554 creating the Municipality of Cabarroguis named and honored the late Leon Cabarroguis, former Congressman of Nueva Vizcaya. Being a newly created Municipality, it was still under the process of procurement of the office facilities that is why Dibibi is still under the Municipal Government of Aglipay.

It was in the early 70's that Dibibi is under the Municipal Government of Cabarroguis.

Every May 25<sup>th</sup> of the Year is the barangay's Patronal Fiesta/Foundation Day.

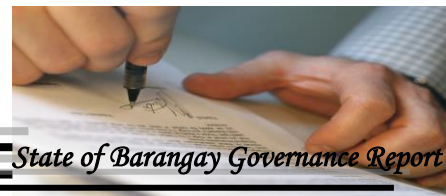

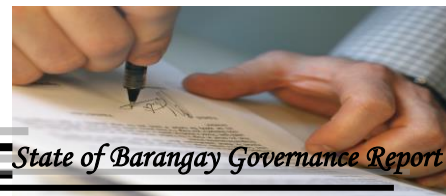

The State of Barangay Governance Report shows that the barangay's overall performance rating is 0.97 or equivalent to 4. The area of Economic Development and Environmental Management should be the top priority for development considering that the adjectival rating is high to focus on the service areas of Entrepreneurship, Promotion Revenue Generation, Social Activities.

In general, the level of effort which had brought about desirable performance or condition in the areas of Environmental Management has to be sustained.

Problematic areas have to be given full consideration. Otherwise, the pace of development and change will be slowed down by the problems. Starting on the ensuing year, the following initiatives shall be pursued:

The Personal Services had an allotment of 2,121,456.00. Among the sectors, it received the biggest share of 55 % of the total budget.

The barangay garnered an overall performance rating of 4 or a remark of compliance to the minimum requirements of the 1991 LGC and other laws; sustained the good practice in the barangay governance. Despite overcoming the rigorous processes in the implementation of the different policies and programs in the barangay, there are still several issues/deficiencies which need necessary improvement:

On Administration, where we have nine (9) service areas, it earned an average performance rating of 0.84 which denotes a performance level of 4. This is attributed to the barangay legislation, transparency, citizen's participation, development planning, revenue code, revenue allocation and utilization, financial accountability, facilities and customer service and human resource development and management.

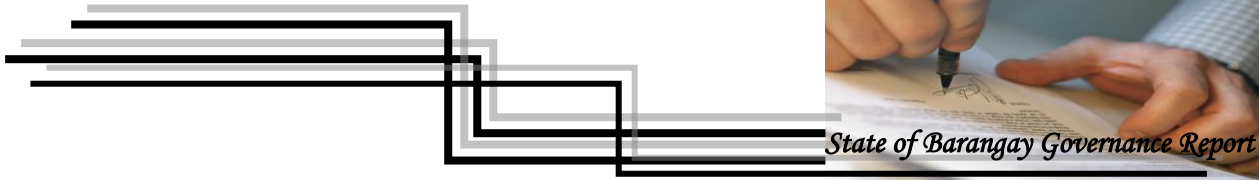
On Social Services, we obtained an average rating of 0.82 which indicates of 4 performance level. This is credited to the health and nutrition, education, culture and sports, human and children and public safety and DRRM.

On Economic Development, the barangay got an average rating of 0.55 or a performance level of 3 which needs minor reinforcement in the regards to the barangay compliance to the minimum requirement of the LGC of 1991. This attributed to agricultural and fisheries development and Entrepreneurship, Business and Industry Promotion.

Also rated is how the barangay fared in Environmental Management under the Service Areas of Natural Resources Management and Waste Management and Pollution Control where it garnered an average rating of 0.93 with a performance level of 4. This is attributed to the Natural resource management and waste management and pollution control.

With the full cooperation of all sectors concerned, it paved the way towards the success of the year under review, CY 2023.





## V. Report Findings

### 1. Administration

Barangay administration is one of the crucial and essential functions of the barangay. All local government units including the barangay need to undergo self-assessment to measure their performance in terms of delivery of services.

There are nine (9) sub areas which include Local Legislation, Transparency, Citizens' Participation, Development Planning, Revenue Generation, Revenue Allocation and Utilization, Financial Accountability, Facilities and Customer Service, and lastly Human Resource Development and Management.

- LOCAL LEGISLATION**

Legislation is the heart of governance. This is the foundation of effective implementation of laws which leads to a better management and development of the LGU.

One of the basic functions/roles of the Sanggunian is the enactment of ordinances and adoption of resolution. This process is called legislation. In order to formulate responsive ordinances/resolutions, there is a need to have proper structure and processes. A monitoring process is needed in order to check the implementation of ordinances.

Of the nine (9) indicators, Barangay Dibibi obtained an average rating of 0.94 indicators or remarks of compliance to the minimum requirements of the 1991 LGC and other laws; sustain the good practice in the barangay. Among 9 indicators one indicator is absent and 8 are present.

**Analysis:**

Barangay Dibibi didn't meet with the required minimum number of regular session due to the conflict schedule of barangay activities but it was covered through special session.

• **TRANSPARENCY**

Public trust should always be given premium/importance by the barangay officials. It is necessary that their constituents are informed and made aware of the operation of the barangay affairs. This is easily done if the barangay opens in all its transactions and operation to the public.

The Barangay Governance Performance Management (BGPMS) of Dibibi maintained in posting monthly itemized collection, disbursement and other important matter be posted in conspicuous spaces for transparency.







The involvement and participation of the different stakeholders is very important especially in voicing out their concerns and aspirations for the barangay. Their inputs are also vital during planning and formulation of laws.

Citizens' participation is one of the important aspects of governance. This is a manifestation that supreme power is lodged to the citizenry.

The Barangay Governance of Dibibi ensured the participation of all organization and constituents in this barangay to maintain peaceful barangay.

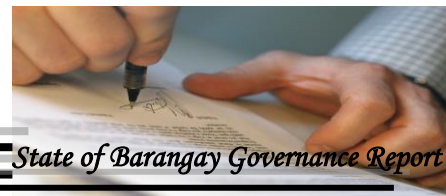
• **DEVELOPMENT PLANNING**

• **REVENUE GENERATION**

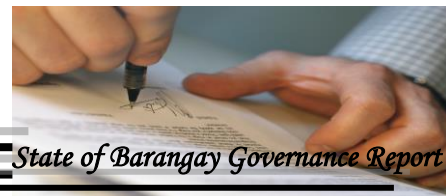

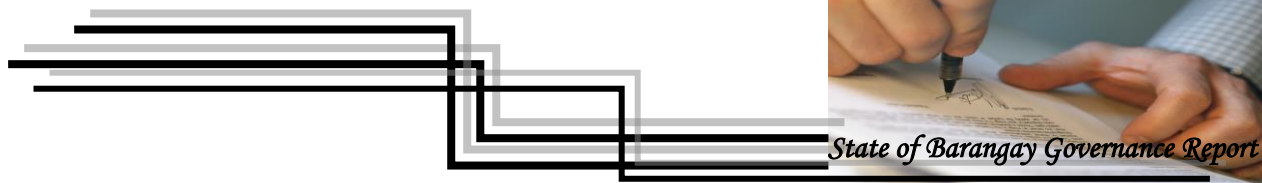

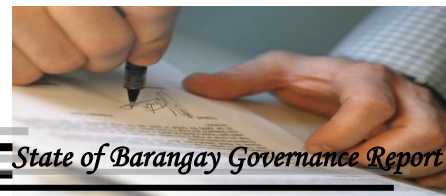
• **HUMAN RESOURCE MANAGEMENT AND DEVELOPMENT**

### *III. Social Services*

The Barangay, although the smallest political unit, plays a very important role in the delivery of basic services to its constituents as provided for in the Local Government Code. There are three services under this performance area that determines if the barangay's program, project and activities are in harmony with the LGC. The 3 service areas are Health and Nutrition, Education, Culture and Sports and Peace, Security and Disaster Preparedness

Health is wealth. This is the reason why most officials prioritize health and nutrition services. Although higher LGUs, such as the province and municipality, provide health and nutrition services, the barangay also is mandated to deliver basic health and nutrition services to its constituents.

The Barangay has put up its Botika, however, it was not operational during the year. The barangay uses a newly built solar powered water pump which contains earth debris.

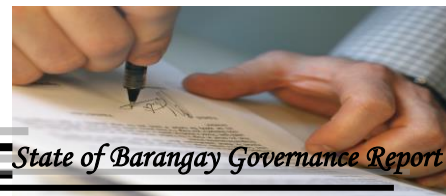

The barangay has to designate Kasambahay Desk to monitor the registration of kasambahay with the full support of Barangay Population Worker and Barangay Health Workers who conducted monthly monitoring of barangay inhabitants.

The barangay officials has to implement BCPC to handle Children of Risk and Children in Conflict with the Law. The Council has to coordinate efforts with the office of the MSWDO for its further assistance to the victims if ever there are case may be arise.

All local government units, Province, City, Municipality and Barangay have the duty of maintaining peace and order in its geographical area. Disasters brought about by natural and man-made calamities necessitate preparedness of the barangay to mitigate or prevent the ill effects of calamity or disaster in the lives and properties of the people.

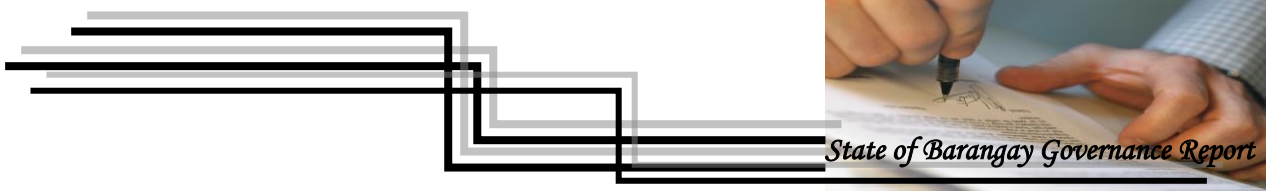

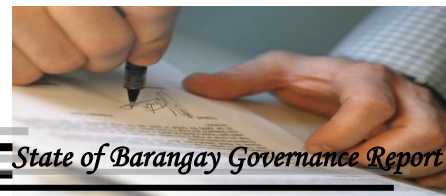

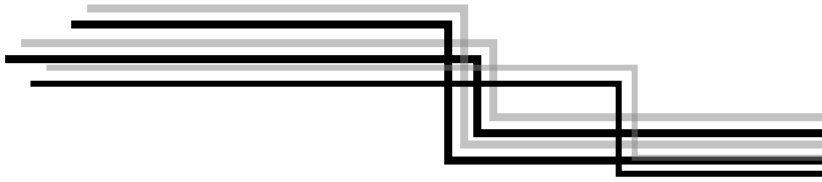
## VII. Conclusion

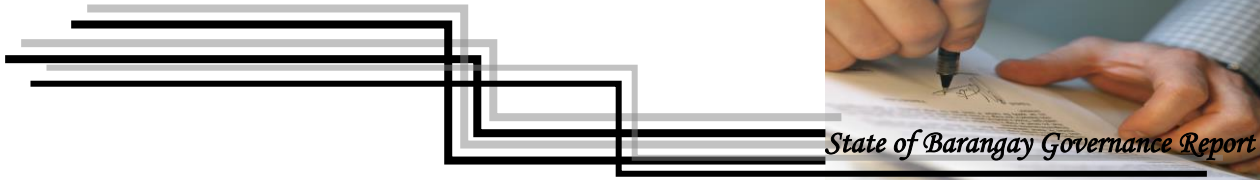

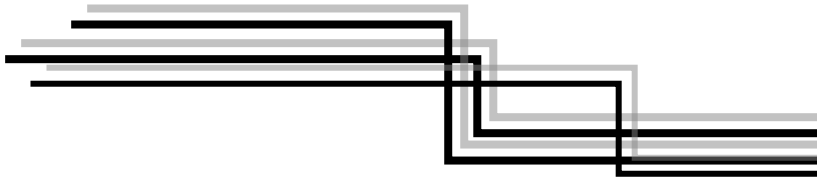
