## Brief History of the Barangay

Barangay Gomez is located more or less 10 kilometers from the provincial Capitol of Quirino. It is the adjacent barangay of Burgos, Villarose, Calaocan and Dibibi. It contains an area of 601.07 hectares according to municipal assessor's office composed of ; residential, agricultural and forestlands.

Barangay Gomez was once a part of Barangay Burgos (Luna) called Sitio Hilltop with 13 families composed of Ilocanoes and Ifugao settlers. These families organized themselves into an association named "Upland Banana Planters Association" appointing Mr. Pablo Guinto as the chairman. Later, on the year 1980, Sitio Hilltop became barangay through the initiative of the leaders under the administration of the late Assemblyman Orlando C. Dulay and former Mayor Herminiano Barcelá. Mr Pablo Guinto was the first appointed Barangay captain of the new created barangay Gomez from 1980 to 1983; he was followed in succession by the following:

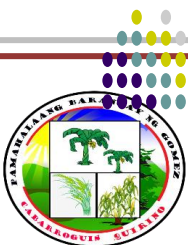

The State of Barangay Governance Report shows that the barangay's overall performance rating is 3 or equivalent to 68%.



The area of **Economic Development 53%** should be the top priority for development considering that the adjectival rating is 53% to focus on the service areas of Entrep., Busi. & Industry promotion with 30% , also on under focus on **Environmental Management 69%** area in the service area of which has 67 % to focus on implementation of programs in the forest conservation through green brigade and on **Social Services 72 %** on the service area of Women and Children with 58 % to focus on establishment of reading center and conduct of BCPC quarterly meetings, implement RA 9344 and submission of KASAMBAHAY report to PESO.

In general, the level of effort which had brought about desirable performance or condition in the area Administration 80 % has to be sustained or work for better result.

Problematic areas have to be given full consideration. Otherwise, the pace of development and change will be slowed down by the problems. Starting on the ensuing year, the following initiatives shall be pursued.

#### **On Social Services**

2. Formulate ordinances on Forest preservation.
3. Formulate and Implement BESWM Plan.



### On Financial Performance

The Calendar Year 2023 Budget amounted to PHP 2,234,053.00. The expenditure program was distributed as follows:

The personal Services had an allotment of PHP 1,051,084.00. Among the sectors, it received the biggest share of 55% of the total budget.

On the other hand, the total picture of fund utilization shows that the barangay incurred PHP \_\_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_% expenses of its budget. Overall indicates a PFP \_\_\_\_\_ savings.

Significantly, the barangay spent its financial resources hugely on Personal services (55%).

The barangay garnered an overall performance rating of **68%** or an adjectival rating of **needs minor reinforcements**. Despite overcoming the rigorous processes in the implementation of the different policies and programs in the barangay, there are still several issues/deficiencies which need necessary improvement:

On Administration, where we have nine (9) service areas, it earned an average performance rating of 80% which denotes compliant to the minimum requirements of the LGC 1991 and other laws. This is attributed to the adherence of barangay legislation, on transparency, Citizens' Participation, Development Planning, Revenue Generation, Revenue Allocation and Utilization, and Financial Accountability, Facilities and Customer Service and Human Resource and Management;

On Social Services, we obtained an average rating of 72% which indicates compliant to the minimum requirements of the LGC 1991 and other laws. This is credited to the absence of reading center, no Lingo ng Kabataan conducted, NO BCPC and other BBIs meetings and no KASAMBAHAY monthly report submitted to PESO, not implemented RA 9344.

On Economic Development, the barangay got an average rating of 53% or needs major reinforcement(s) which points out on the absence of some income generating facilities of the barangay in Entrep. Business & Industry Promotion which most of the indicators stated at the DCF were not applicable in our locality.

Also rated is how the barangay struggled to improve in Environmental Management under the Service Areas of Natural Resources Management and Waste Management and Pollution Control where it garnered an average rating of 69% from 67% of 2018. This is attributed to the promotion of clean-up drive, tree planting activities & improvement of Solid Waste Management scheme and construction of material recovery facility in the barangay for the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2018 and sustained up to this year.





With the full cooperation of all sectors concerned paved the way towards the success of the year under review, CY 2023.

## Report Findings

### 1. Administration

All local government units including the barangay need to undergo self-assessment to measure their performance in terms of delivery of services. This includes the Administrative System and Procedures the Sanggunian uses in running the affairs of the barangay. It contains indicators that measure the Barangays performance which include the assessment on the functionality of barangay equipment or facilities.

Barangay administration is one of the crucial and essential functions of the barangay. This includes 9 indicators: Local Legislation, Transparency and Citizens' Participation, Development Planning; Human Resource and Development; Customer Services; Financial Accountability; Revenue Generation and Resource Allocation and Utilization.

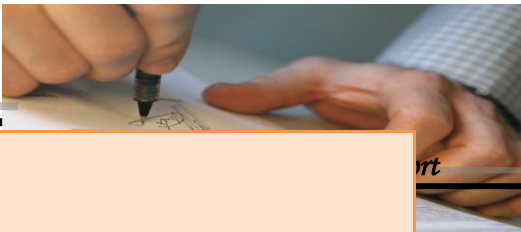
#### LOCAL LEGISLATION

Legislation is the heart of governance. This is the foundation of effective implementation of laws which leads to a better management and development of the LGU.

One of the basic functions/roles of the Sanggunian is the enactment of ordinances and adoption of resolution. This process is called legislation. In order to formulate responsive ordinances/resolutions, there is a need to have proper structure and processes. A monitoring process is needed in order to check the implementation of ordinances.

Of the nine (9) indicators, Barangay Gomez obtained **8** indicators or **87%**.

We have implemented our formulated IRP, passed program related resolutions, implemented legislative tracking using NGAS, presence of session table but the Sangguniang Barangay members especially the Barangay Kagawad failed to enact or formulate ordinances due to lack capacity development on formulation of ordinances. This year 2024, they are doing their best of their capacity to formulate ordinances for the better of Barangay Gomez.



**TRANSPARENCY**

Public trust should always be given premium/ importance by the barangay officials. It is necessary that their constituents are informed and made aware of the operation of the barangay affairs. This is easily done if the barangay opens all transactions and operation to the public.

No ordinances formulated this preceeding year, reolutions aren't posted at conspicuous places but the Sangguniang Barangay members informed the residents about the resolutions formulated to address the barangay issues during Barangay Assembly Day and on some especiall gatherings in the barangay.

**CITIZEN'S PARTICIPATION**

The involvement and participation of the different stakeholders is very important especially in voicing out their concerns and aspirations for the barangay. Their inputs are also vital during planning and formulation of laws.

Citizen's participation is one of the important aspects of governance; this is a manifestation that supreme power is lodged to the citizenry.

Of the 8 indicators, Barangay Gomez obtained 7 indicators or 88%.

We are compliant on performance level on implementing BDC, BDP & other CSOs; formulated our AIP of the preceeding year but we failed to conduct BDC meeting, but every Barangay Assembly Day the Sangguniang Barangay members consult and gathers all the issues from the Barangay residents and making their best effort to address the arising problems.

### **REVENUE GENERATION**

Laws/ordinances enacted/passed by the Sangguniang Barangay for the collection of taxes, fees and charges or generate revenues. RA 7160 allows the barangay to create provide other sources of funds for development projects that will benefit the barangay residents, subject to limitations as provided for by the law.

Of the 5 indicators, Barangay Gomez satisfied 3 indicators or 60% rating.

The Sangguniang Barangay members failed to enact regulatory ordinances, and conduct of Barangay Fund Raising activity but within this year the Sangguniang Barangay members will surely enact and update ordinances especially on tax ordinance integrating the generation of income on barangay economic resources.

**REVENUE ALLOCATION AND UTILIZATION**

Compliance to mandatory budgetary allocations of barangay ensures that the vital service functions are funded and the priority development concerns of the Barangay are implemented.

Further, actual expenditure figures confirm whether the budgetary appropriation have been disbursed for the intended service functions.

Results of the BGPMS Data Capture Form revealed the following:

Of the 6 indicators, Barangay Gomez complied with 5 indicators or 71%.

Although we had complied to the indicators but still there were sub indicators missing, that's why we graded ourselves just a satisfactory rate for fax machine, photocopying machine, and telephone were not so necessary and our barangay's location is too far to access those connections.

Of the 3 indicators, Barangay Gomez obtained 2 indicators or 73% there are lackings for the 3<sup>rd</sup> indicator because of the pandemic but the Barangay Officials are trying to do their best way in order to serve the people.

## II. Social Services

The Barangay, although the smallest political unit, plays a very important role in the delivery of basic services to its constituents as provided for in the Local Government Code. There are three services under this performance area that determines if the barangay's program, project and activities are in harmony with the LGC. The 4 service areas are Health and Nutrition, Education, Culture, Women and Children and Sports and Peace, Security and Disaster Preparedness

### HEALTH AND NUTRITION

Health is wealth. This is the reason why most officials prioritize health and nutrition services. Although higher LGUs, such as the province and municipality, provide health and nutrition services, the barangay also is mandated to deliver basic health and nutrition services to its constituents.

Of the 3 indicators, Barangay Gomez obtained 3 indicators or 97%. Only Botika sa Barangay is lacking due to Barangay fund is not enough. The participation of the Sanguniang barangay, health workers and also the cooperation of the barangay constituents especially when it comes to health and nutrition is to be more strengthen so that the community will become a better and a healthier place to live. On the conduct of IEC on rabies and dengue, the Sangguniang Barangay members is trying to support the ordinance on Anti Rabies Law and the Barangay Health workers and all barangay employees is conducting Oplan Taob semi annually to reduce or prevent cases of Dengue in the barangay.

**EDUCATION, CULTURE AND SPORTS**

Another responsibility objective of the barangay is to deliver programs and projects geared toward mental and physical development of both children and adult, such as programs on sports and enrichment of culture and other modes of accessing/enriching knowledge and information.

Needs minor reinforcement(s), barangay Gomez obtained in this area due to some interventions such as the absence of reading center because we have no barangay office or a safer place to keep the important reading materials such as books/ LT Manuals, etc., where children could not destroy and we could not conduct Linggo ng Kabataan.



## WOMEN AND CHILDREN

Needs minor reinforcement(s) is our adjectival rating in this area in which some of the indicators and sub-indicators were not applicable in our barangay such as the CICL Cases; we don't have case as such this 2015-2023. We don't issued Barangay protection order because the vawc victim failed to file vawc case against her husband because of her personal reason. But there is continuous monitoring of the PNP to the VAWC victim.

All local government units, Province, City, Municipality and Barangay have the duty of maintaining peace and order in its geographical area. Of the 8 indicators, Barangay Gomez obtained 5 indicators or 69%.

Needs minor reinforcements is our adjectival rating in this area because of the adherence of the Council to produce the needs ( information/ warning) of our constituents in order to be ready and protect life and BPOC conducted foot patrols to maintain the barangay as considered generally peaceful and drug free.KP monthly meetings were not conducted because of very rare case filed in the barangay.

## II. Economic Development

Good economic condition in the Barangay paves the way for a better or improved standard of living of the constituents. Establishment of livelihood programs, creation of opportunities and other forms of economic activities are contributory to the economic development of the people in the barangay.

The Barangay needs minor reinforcement especially in the Barangay Agricultural support especially distribution of planting materials and buying station but the farm to market roads is always the concerned of the community because Gomez is an agricultural land where most of the people are engaged on farming. On Aquatic Resources, considering the location or the topography of the Barangay it is not applicable for aquatic production but some of the households raised their own fishpond for food consumption only not for business purposes. The Punong Barangay is already starting to organize BFARMC it is due to the number of fishpond owners increases this year.

**ENTREPRENEURSHIP, BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY PROMOTION**

It is important that the barangay gives attention to its entrepreneurship and industry promotion to attract investors in its community.

Of the 5 indicators, Barangay Gomez obtained 1.5 indicator or 30 % our barangay is considered non-compliant cause Brgy Economic Enterprise such as flea market or talipapa, were given priority to our constituents so that they could earn some living out from it. Jobs fair and cooperatives were not applicable in our locality because our barangay is located at the mountainous part of Cabarroguis. Hence the barangay has its program to the farmers the carabo and cow dispersal in which the residents of the barangay were given a chance to have their own livestock thru this dispersal program.



### III. Environmental Management

The Local Government Code clearly defines the role of the LGUs in maintaining ecological balance. This performance area has 2 service areas which include Natural Resources Management and Waste Management

## IV. Alternative Courses of Action



Data showed that we should give the most attention on the service area of Economic Development which is only 53% it emphasizes that the Sangguniang Barangay must do something to up lift the economic life of the people through programs and services from the LGU. **“Ang pag-unlad ng bawat mamamayan ay pag-unlad ng bayan”**. On the Environmental Management, sangguniang Barangay members should enact and implement ordinances on Proper waste management control and come up with a BESWM Plan and must sustain the greening activities. Meetings of Barangay Based Institution should be conducted regularly to come up with a plan on how to address the problems or issues arising from the different service area like from Health Nutrition, Women and Children and etc.

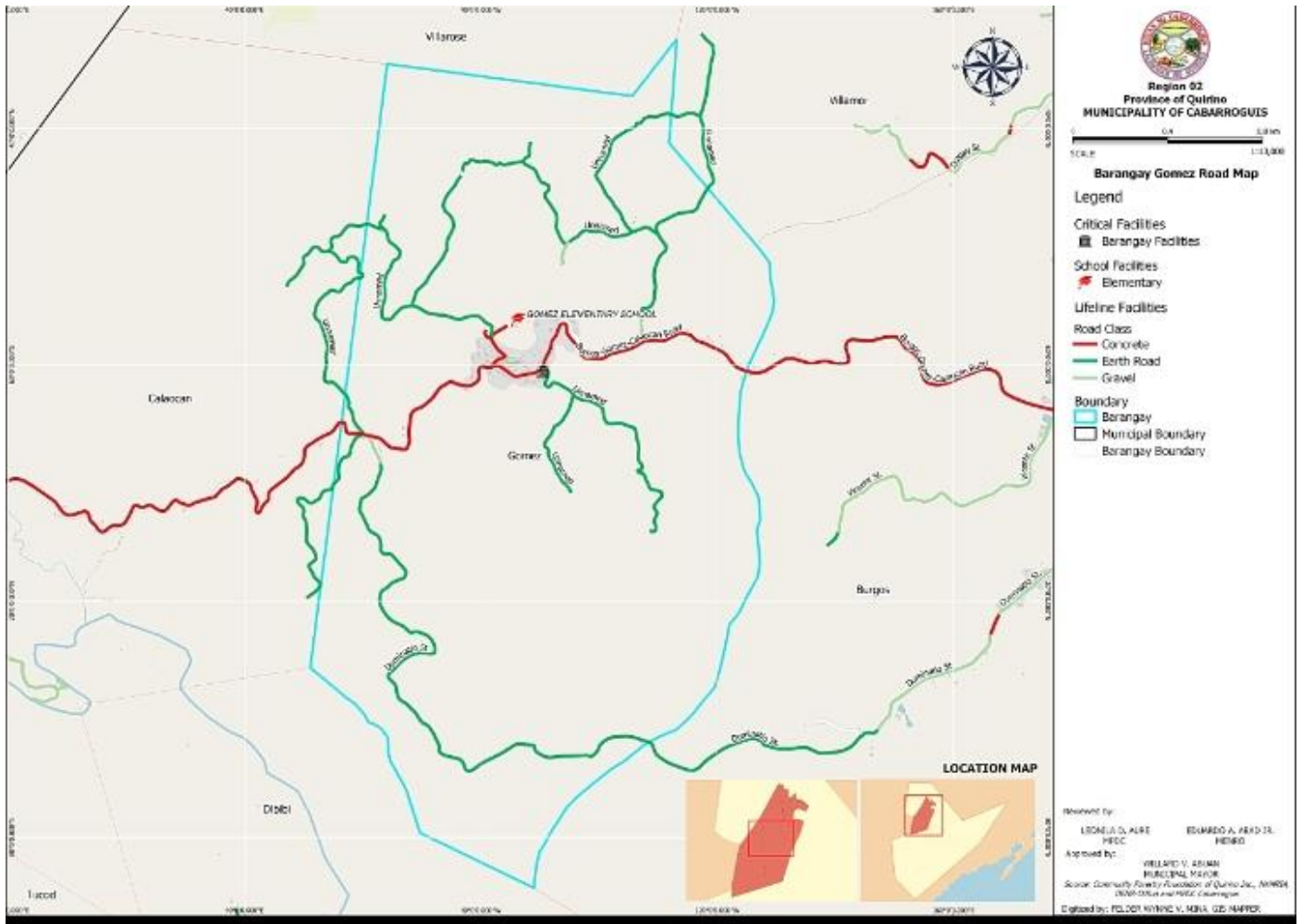
