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## Brief History of the Barangay

San Marcos was formerly named Cannuangan. At first, it was just a sitio of Cajel, Diffun, Nueva Vizcaya. The name originated from the first settlers of this place who claimed to have constantly heard many carabaos running to and from the place, hence the name Cannuangan, meaning a place with many carabaos.

In 1936, among the first settlers of this place were Pantaleon Ruiz, Santiago Rasalan, Angel Anunsacion, Leon Pagarigan, Feliciano Malaque, Severio Abenoja, Anacito Abenoja, Domingo Mauyao and Amado Fabros Abenoja the donor of the present School Site of San Marcos Elementary School.

The coming of the Japanese soldier prompted the first settlers to abandon this place, but when the Americans came in 1945, they returned and cleared the still virgin lands. The settlers delegated authority to some leaders who took turns in acting as their temporary heads, among whom were Feliciano Malaque, Domingo and Marcos Mauyao.

With the election of Hon. Silverio Pascua as the first Municipal Mayor of Diffun, Nueva Vizcaya, he designed Amado F. Abenoja as the first Tenyente Del Barrio of Cannuangan. Among the many good things accomplished during the term of Amado F. Abenoja was the changing of cannuangan to San Marcos. The name San Marcos was derived from a very good leader who passed away ahead of the pioneers. Marcos Mauyao, jokingly perhaps because the late Marcos Mauyao was a very religious man, they gave the title san to Marcos, thus San Marcos was born. A resolution to that effect was passed and was approved by the Mayor Silverio Pascua an education was already a primary concern at that time in many new barangay. The Tenyente del Barrio felt the need, so then Amado F. Abenoja donated one hectare of his acquired lands as the Primary School of San Marcos which was erected in 1956 and in the following year, it was opened with Mrs. Manuela Saguis Pimentel, wife of the former Gov. Mariano Pimentel as the first teacher of Grade 1&2. At present the school has complete elementary grades from 1 to 6 and presently accepting Kindergarten pre-school 1&2.

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The State of Barangay Governance Report shows that the barangay's overall performance rating is 90% or equivalent to 4. The area of Economic Development and Administration should be the top priority for development considering that the remarks are Compliant to focus on the service areas of Agriculture, Fisheries Development, Entrepreneurship, Business, Industry Promotion and Revenue Generation.

In general, the level of effort which had brought about desirable performance or condition in the areas of Social Service and Environmental Management has to be sustained.

Problematic areas have to be given full consideration. Otherwise, the pace of development and change will be slowed down by the problems. Starting on the ensuing year, the following initiatives shall be pursued.

***On Administration***

1. The Sanguniang Barangay must have to sustain what have been gained and established and institute measures to address the Problematic one.

2. For the succeeding year, the barangay would try its best to improve its revenue Collection effort which is the primary support to its IRA.

***On Social Services***

1. The barangay council must source out funds to re-establish the Botika sa Barangay to provide the residents ready and affordable medicines. Likewise, the barangay must establish its reading center and provide the needed reading materials.





### **On Economic Development**

1. The barangay must create more farm to market roads to enable the far-flung farmers to sell their products and encourage them to plant more likewise the barangay should establish a communal business with the common residents.

### **On Environmental Management**

1. The barangay must sustain its solid waste segregation and provide disposal program

### **On Financial Performance**

The CY 2023 Budget amounted to 4,465,024.00

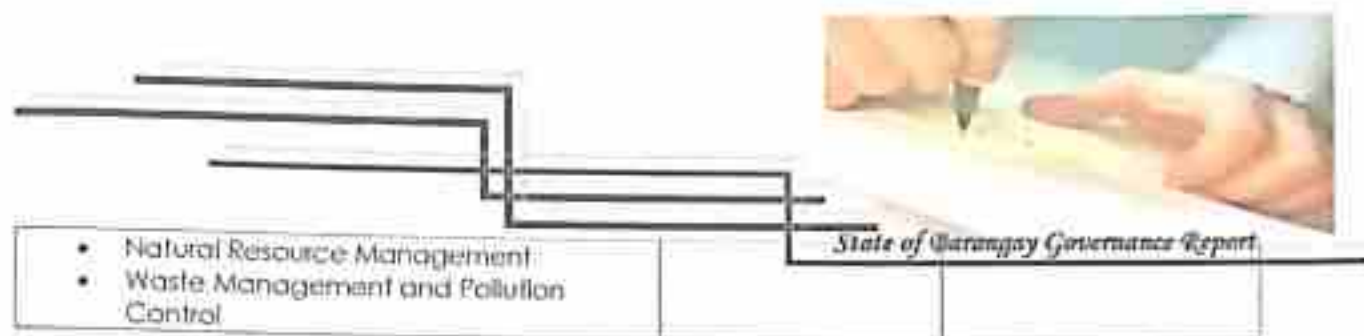

The barangay garnered an overall performance rating of 87% or remarks of Compliant to the minimum requirements of the 1991 LGC other laws. Despite overcoming the rigorous processes in the implementation of the different policies and programs in the

Barangay, there are still several issues/deficiencies which need necessary improvement:

On Administration, where we have nine (9) service areas, it earned an average performance rating of 97% which denotes to sustain the good practice in the barangay. This is attributed to the strict implementation and adherence to all requirements, guidelines and or mandates governing the service area:

On Social Services, we obtained an average rating of 84% which indicates to sustain the good practice in the barangay. This is credited to the provisions of almost all the needed requirements and diligent exercise of duties and function of concerned employees.

On Economic Development, the barangay got an average rating of 68% or which points out that the barangay needs to promote livelihood projects and program.

Also rated is how the barangay fared in Environmental Management under the Service Areas of Natural Resources Management and Waste Management and Pollution Control where it garnered an average rating of 100% This is attributed to the strict implementation of solid waste ordinance focusing on waste segregation and regular hauling of garbages.

With the full cooperation of all sectors concerned, it paved the way towards the success of the year under review, CY 2023.





## V. Report Findings

### 1. Administration

Barangay administration is one of the crucial and essential functions of the barangay. All local government units including the barangay need to undergo self-assessment to measure their performance in terms of delivery of services.

There are nine (9) sub areas which include Local Legislation, Transparency, Citizens' Participation, Development Planning, Revenue Generation, Revenue Allocation and Utilization, Financial Accountability, Facilities and Customer Service, and lastly Human Resource Development and Management.

#### > LOCAL LEGISLATION

Legislation is the heart of governance. This is the foundation of effective implementation of laws which leads to a better management and development of the LGU.

One of the basic functions/roles of the Sanggunian is the enactment of ordinances and adoption of resolution. This process is called legislation. In order to formulate responsive ordinances/resolutions, there is a need to have proper structure and processes. A monitoring process is needed in order to check the implementation of ordinances.

Of the nine (9) indicators, Barangay San Marcos obtained 8 indicators or remarks of Compliant to the minimum requirements of the 1991 LGC.

It is the absence of the Barangay Economic Enterprises and Legislative Tracking or monitoring system that affected the rating in this Performance Area.

Public trust should always be given premium/importance by the barangay officials. It is necessary that their constituents are informed and made aware of the operation of the barangay affairs. This is easily done if the barangay opens in all its transactions and operation to the public.

Of the 3 indicators, Barangay San Marcos obtained 100% average or remarks of Sustain the good practice in the barangay.

### III. Social Services

The Barangay, although the smallest political unit, plays a very important role in the delivery of basic services to its constituents as provided for in the Local Government Code. There are three services under this performance area that determines if the barangay's program, project and activities are in harmony with the LGC. The 3 service areas are Health and Nutrition, Education, Culture and Sports and Peace, Security and Disaster Preparedness

#### ➤ HEALTH AND NUTRITION

Health is wealth. This is the reason why most officials prioritize health and nutrition services. Although higher LGUs, such as the province and municipality, provide health and nutrition services, the barangay also is mandated to deliver basic health and nutrition services to its constituents.

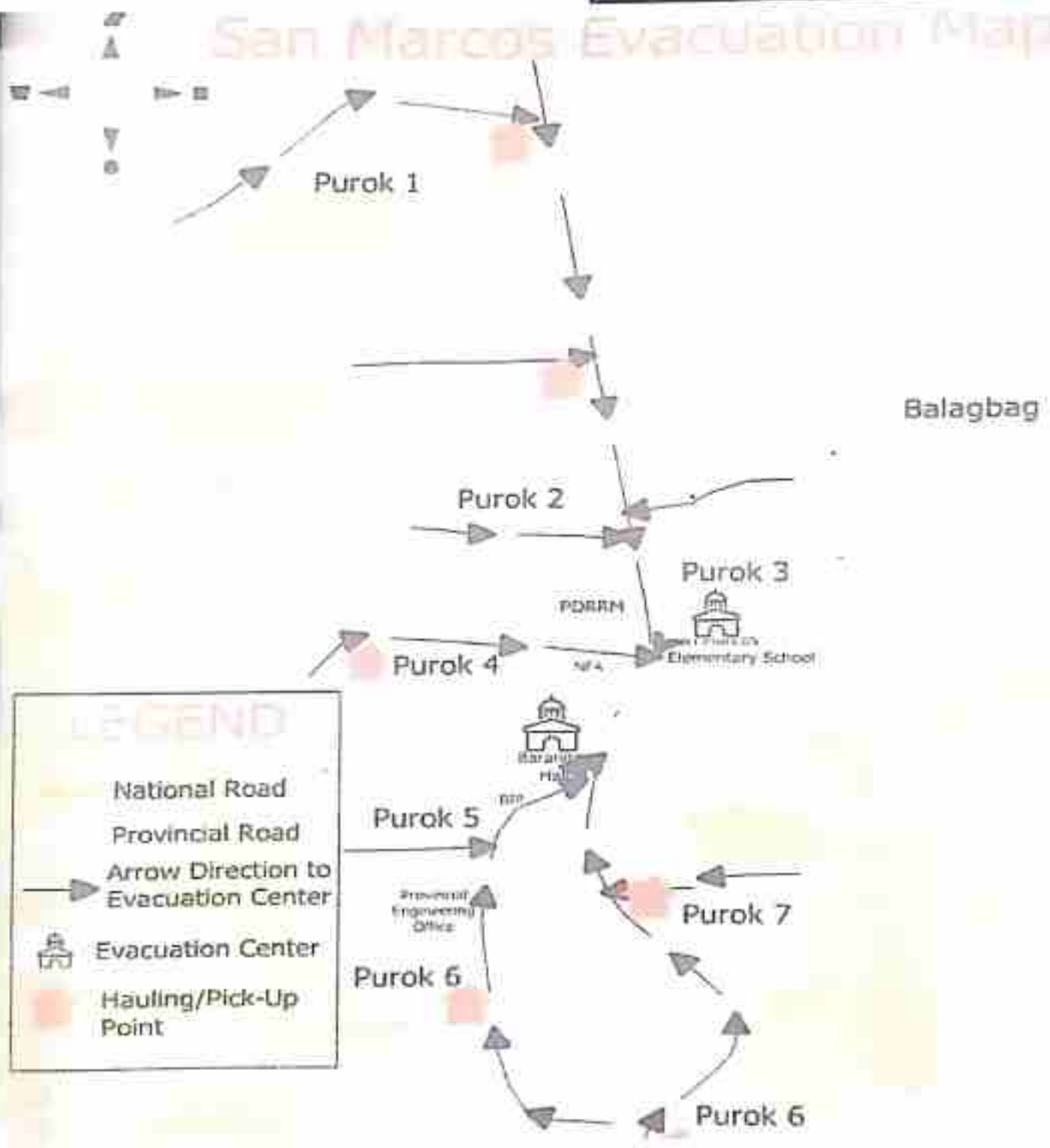

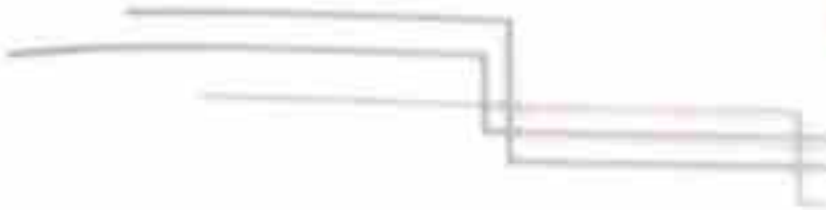
