



Executive Order No. 041

AN ORDER REORGANIZING THE MUNICIPAL PEACE AND ORDER COUNCIL (MPOC) AND ITS COMPONENT TEAMS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF CABARROGUIS, QUIRINO

WHEREAS, the threat to peace and order posed by criminality and terrorism requires the dedicated efforts of all governmental official and citizens;

WHEREAS, it is the duty of local governments, the law enforcement agencies, the prosecution services, and institutions of Government to assist the Chief Executive in the proper enforcement of the laws and the administration of justice;

WHEREAS, Government efforts at peace and order need to be fully coordinated to effectively prevent and suppress criminality and to maintain public order and safety in the land;

WHEREAS, the participation of the citizenry in peace and order is of critical importance;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, AVELINO N. AGUSTIN, JR., Municipal Mayor of Cabarroguis, Quirino, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Constitution and the law, do order and direct the following:

SECTION 1. Reorganization of the Municipal Peace and Order Council. – The Municipal Peace and Order Council (MPOC) is hereby further reorganized to be constituted as follows:

Section 1.1. Civil Society Organization Representatives. – To strengthen the participation of civil society organizations in local governance and development processes, selection of Civil Society Organization (CSO) representatives to Local Special Bodies has been undertaken. As a result of the selection process, upon due

consultation and concurrence of the Council, the membership of the following CSOs in the MPOC is hereby confirmed:

SECTION 2. Duties and Functions of the Municipal Peace and Order Council. – The MPOC shall have the following duties and functions:

- a. Convene the MPOC quarterly or as often as the need arises;
- b. Invite concerned agencies not included in EO 773, s. 2009 to join or participate in MPOC meetings and activities;
- c. Formulate a three-year Peace and Order and Public Safety (POPS) Plan to be included in the Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP);
- d. Provide a forum for inter-disciplinary dialogue and deliberation of major issues and concerns affecting peace and order, and public safety, including insurgency;
- e. Recommend strategic actions or activities aimed at promoting, improving or enhancing measures, within the municipality;
- f. Recommend measures to converge and orchestrate internal security operations efforts of civil authorities and agencies, military, and police;
- g. Formulate and adopt an effective mechanism for the coordination, cooperation, and consultation involving the local executives, citizenry, and law enforcement agencies under Republic Act No. 6975, as amended, in the adoption of the Community and Service-Oriented Policing (CSOP) System;
- h. Apply moral suasion to and/or recommend sanctions against local chief executives who are giving material and political support to the insurgents;
- i. Monitor the provision of livelihood and infrastructure development programs and projects in the remote rural and indigenous population areas to isolate them from the insurgents' ideological, political and reorganization works;
- j. Create a Special Action Committee to address the immediate issues on peace and order and public safety, in case of emergencies;
- k. Create a Technical Working Group for the purpose of POPS Planning, following the guidelines prescribed by the DILG on the tools and processes on POPS Planning;
- l. Submit semestral POC Accomplishment Reports to the National POC through the respective POC Secretariats;
- m. Support the implementation of the Enhanced Comprehensive Local Integration Program (E-CLIP) at the Provincial POC levels;
- n. Provide staff and financial support to the POC Secretariat; and
- o. Perform other functions that may be directed by law, the National POC, or the President.

Section 3. Special Action Committee. – The Special Action Team is likewise created to take action on any critical or emergency situation, as well as address the immediate issues on peace and order and public safety, in case of emergencies.

Section 4. Peace and Order Council Technical Working Group. – The POC Technical Working Group (TWG) will be primarily responsible for the drafting and completion of an evidence-based and results-oriented POPS Plan, as well as the submission of semestral POC Accomplishment Reports through the POPS Policy Compliance Monitoring System (PCMS).

4.1. Composition of the TWG. – The POC TWG shall be composed of the following:

For wider representation, additional personalities may be invited to consultative meetings or workshops.

4.2. Tasks and Responsibilities of the TWG. – The TWG shall have the following tasks and responsibilities:

- a. Prepare documents that could serve as reference for the profiling of the strategic direction and peace and order and public safety issues in the locality;
- b. Conduct data gathering and stakeholder consultations as needed and analyze data gathered;
- c. Coordinate with communities or barangays for data gathering and action planning for implementation of POPS Plan;
- d. Present data to the POC for prioritization of issues and development of strategies;
- e. Participate in the POPS planning process; draft parts of the POPS Plan as assigned, and participate in the write shop that would finalize the POPS Plan;
- f. In coordination with the Local Chief Executive, convene the MPOC and present the plan for discussion, approval, and appropriate action;
- g. Take part in the submission and adoption of the POPS Plan;
- h. Coordinate with internal and external stakeholders for effective communication and monitoring as laid out in the POPS Plan;
- i. Ensure inclusion of key programs or strategies such as the CSOP and conflict-sensitivity, if deemed appropriate, in the POPS Plan;
- j. Establish and manage a monitoring and evaluation system and regularly submit Accomplishment Reports. Coordinate adjustment to the POPS Plan as needed.

Section 5. Municipal Peace and Order Council Secretariat. – The MPOC Secretariat shall be headed by the Municipal Local Government Operations Officer (MLGOO) of the DILG who shall handle the administrative and technical activities of the Council. The Secretariat shall also undertake liaisoning and coordination of activities with appropriate agencies of the government.

The Secretariat shall be assisted in its functions and duties by the regular staff of the Council Chairperson.

Section 5.2. Roles and Functions of the MPOC Secretariat. – The MPOC Secretariat shall:


- a. Assist the Chairperson in the conduct of MPOC meetings;
- b. Provide technical assistance in the performance of administrative and technical tasks of the MPOC;
- c. Recommend and prepare MPOC agenda and other required documents during POC meetings;

- d. Prepare resolutions of the Council and the minutes of the meeting;
- e. Prepare and submit semestral POC Accomplishment Reports to the NPOC, through the PPOC Secretariat;
- f. Prepare and submit quarterly MPOC Secretariat Accomplishment Reports to the NPOC, through the PPOC Secretariat;
- g. Monitor municipal peace and order situation and submit a quarterly report to the NPOC, through the PPOC Secretariat;
- h. Monitor functionality of the BPOC and submit annual Functionality Report;
- i. Provide technical support or assistance to activities related to E-CLIP, PAMANA, Regional Task Forces, and other programs concerned with peace and public safety of the municipality; and
- j. Perform such other tasks as may be directed by the Council.

Section 6. Repealing Clause. – All prior issuances on the organization and functions of the Peace and Order Council inconsistent herewith shall be deemed superseded by this Order.

Section 7. Effectivity. – This Order shall take effect immediately.
