**ORDINANCE DECLARING LIQUOR BAN IN TIMES OF CALAMITIES IN THE PROVINCE
OF QUIRINO AS PART OF DISASTER RISK REDUCTION MANAGEMENT.**

WHEREAS, it was a declared policy of the local government unit to uphold the constitutional rights to life and property by addressing the root causes of vulnerabilities to disasters, strengthening the LGU capacity for disaster risk reduction and management and building the resilience of local communities to disasters including climate change impacts;

WHEREAS, disaster risk reduction is a systematic approach to identifying, assessing and reducing the risks of disasters, aiming to reduce socio-economic vulnerabilities to disasters as well as dealing with the environment and the hazards that trigger them;

WHEREAS, there are national agencies that provide early warning to people, such as the PHILVOLCS and PAG-ASA which issue volcanic and weather forecasts days before an upcoming calamities to give warning to areas that would be possibly affected, for the people to prepare and be ready;

WHEREAS, people awareness and alertness are important factors in saving lives, thereby lessening the negative impacts of any disaster.

NOW THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Roldan E. Ubando duly seconded by Hon. Julius Caesar S. Vaquilar with the unanimous accord of all other members present, be it-

BE IT ENACTED by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan duly assembled, that:

Section 1. **Statement of Purpose.** That an ordinance declaring liquor ban in times of calamities and disasters in the province of Quirino as part of disaster risk reduction management is hereby enacted and approved.



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To ensure safety and alertness of the constituents, liquor ban shall be deemed declared six (6) hours before the predicted landfall or onslaught of the hazard and twelve (12) hours after the hazard struck.

Section 2. Definition of Terms. For the purpose of this ordinance, the following definition of terms shall be applied:

1. Calamity or Disaster – a sudden, accidental event that causes many deaths and injuries. Most disasters also result in significant property damage. The calamity or disaster herein defined shall refer to “acts of God” and not “acts of man” which includes but not limited to typhoons and earthquakes.
2. Disaster preparedness – the knowledge and capacities developed by governments, professional response and recovery organizations, communities and individuals to effectively anticipate, respond to, and recover from the impacts of likely, imminent or current hazardous events or conditions.
3. Hazards - a dangerous phenomenon, substance or condition that may cause loss of life, injury or other health impacts, property damage, loss of livelihood and services, social and economic disruption or environmental damage. Examples of hazards are typhoons, floods, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, and landslides.
4. Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction Management Officer or PDRRMO – a designated person in the provincial level of disaster management with the main function of monitoring and coordinating the process of disaster management in the area of jurisdiction. Its counterpart in the municipalities is the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Management Officer or MDRRMO.
5. Intoxicating Beverages – as used in this ordinance, shall mean and include alcohol for beverage purposes, alcoholic, spirituous, vinous, fermented, malt or other liquors, or combination of liquors, a part of which is spirituous, vinous or fermented, and all preparations or mixtures for beverage purposes, containing in excess of one half of one percent by volume.
6. Typhoon - It is a large, powerful and violent tropical cyclone. It is a low pressure rotating counterclockwise and containing rising warm air that forms over warm water in the Western Pacific Ocean. Less powerful tropical cyclones are called Tropical Depression and Tropical Storms. Typhoons can inflict terrible damage due to thunderstorms, violent winds, torrential rain and accompanying fold and landslide and extremely big waves associated with storm surges. Hurricane-force winds can reach out as little as 25 miles from the center of a small hurricane and as far as 150 miles in a large hurricane. The modified Public storm warning signals in the Philippines are;

PSWS 1 winds of 30-60 kph may be expected in at least 36 hours or intermittent rains may be expected within 36 hours.



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PSWS 2 winds of greater than 60 kph and up to 100 kph may be expected in at least 24 hours.

PSWS 3 winds greater than 100 kph to 185 kph may be expected in at least 18 hrs.

PSWS 4 very strong winds of more than 185 kph may be expected in at least 12 hrs.

Section 3. Punishable Acts. Any person who sells, buys, dispenses liquor and drinks intoxicating beverages as defined in Section 2.5 on this ordinance shall be held liable and be subjected to the penalties as prescribed in Section 6 thereof.

Section 4. Scope of Application. This ordinance shall apply to all municipalities and barangays in the province of Quirino whenever the Philippine Atmospheric Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) shall declare the province of Quirino under Public Storm Signal Nos. 2, 3 or 4.

Section 5. Responsibility. The Local Chief Executive through the Chief of Police, PDRRMO/MDRRMO and Punong Barangays shall monitor the implementation of the liquor ban.

Section 6. Penal Clause. Any person who violates the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to the following penalties:

First Offense – P1,500.00 or community service of eight (8) hours for insolvent offenders

Second Offense – P3,000.00 or community service of 12 hours for insolvent offenders

Third Offense – P5,000.00 or community service of 15 hours for insolvent offenders.

Section 6. Accrual of Fines. All fines collected by virtue of this ordinance shall be shared correspondingly by the local government units to wit:

Barangay - 30%

Municipality - 40%

Province - 30%

Section 7. Separability Clause. Should any or part(s) of this ordinance be declared invalid or unconstitutional, the other parts not included shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 8. Repealing Clause. All measures found inconsistent with this ordinance is hereby repealed or modified.

Section 9. This ordinance shall take effect upon approval and copies posted in three strategic places in the Capitol Compound and in the six (6) municipal halls of the province.
