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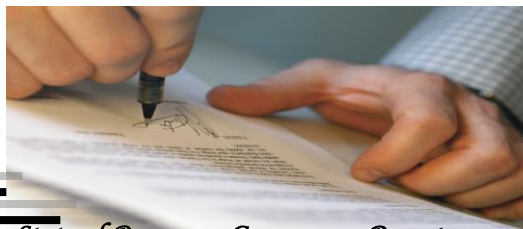

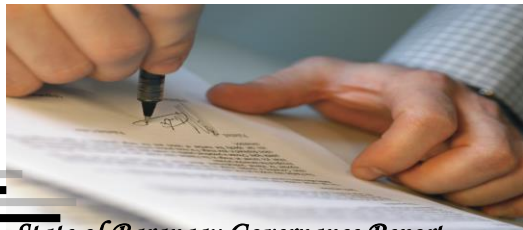

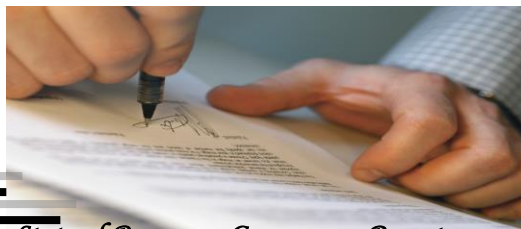

BRIEF HISTORY

BRIEF HISTORY OF BARANGAY VILLAMOR:

Barangay Villamor of the Municipality of Cabarroguis was once a sitio Barangay Gundaway. It is situated at the North-eastern part of the Capital Town of Cabarroguis. It is bounded by barangay Zamora on the east, barangay Villa Rose at the west, barangay Gundaway at the north and barangay Burgos at the South. It has a land area of 864,5322 hectares in which 229.8817 hectares is forest land and 563.2801 hectares is parks and open.

Barangay people of Villamor mostly comes from the province of Nueva Vizcaya, Isabela, Pangasinan, Ilocos Province, Ifugao, Cagayan, Bicol, Visayan Province. Its common medium of communication are Ilocano and Tagalog.

In the early days since 1948. Ilongot and it as roamed around the place but because of the nomadic characteristics of these tribes put them from place to place and finally settled at DIBIBI an interior barangay of Cabarroguis.

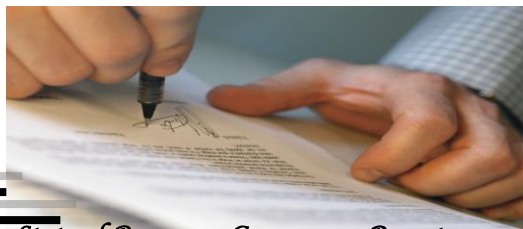
In the year 50's handful hunters headed by Mr. Jacinto Alvarez, a native of Victoria, Tarlac discovered the place. They found forest abound with all sort of wildlife. The creeks were rich of fresh water fishes.

A story told that while these hunters where on their hunt, one companion got wounded near the creek. His legs were lacerated with profuse bleeding. In order to save the life of the hunter, one companion, Estanislao Bascos dare the treatment of the wound by saturating it with rattan fiber. The treatment worked and save the life of hunter. They made the accident more memorable by naming the place "Dinait" which means sewed, since then the place was named Dinait.

In 1956, population grew to 100. In order to maintain peace & order for better unity, they considered necessary to select a leader Mr. Alberto Sombreto as adviser Mr. Alvarez becomes the Barrio Lieutenant. Local rules where formulated such as penalty for settlers of liquors, gambling and steeling. These rules where strictly followed that made people law abiding, obedient, cooperative and self-reliant.

The health situation of the people was safeguard with the presence of the two hobblers, Mr. Estanislao Bascos and Mr. Maximo Gromeo who treated some kind of ailment including child deliveries.





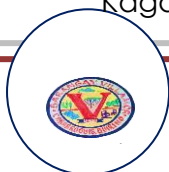
Dinait also welcomed several religious sects. They embraced Roman Catholic, Iglesia ni Cristo 1914, Iglesia ni Cristo 33AD, Espiritistas and Aglipayans. Life Dinait should have been a paradise had it not been for one problem of transportation. They only mean transportation then was use of carabao's and cow pulling cart and sledge with tangkal to transport their commodities.

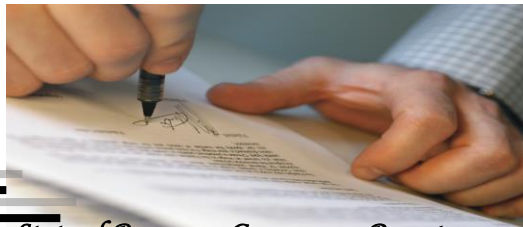
Children have difficulties in hiking going to school as far as 4 kilometers in mountain and slippery trails. People who transact business in Diffun town used to hike 10 kilometers to reach place & back.

In December 1957, the people passed a resolution recommending Dinait to become a barrio. They began giving the Barrio a name. It was at that time, a famous Filipino Pilot by name the name Villamor, once the President and Chairman of the Bureau of Aeronautics was worried known for his GALANTRY & BRAVERY. The people & official agreed to take Villamor appropriate name. Sitio Dinait was renamed Villamor. The approval of Villamor as one barangay was illusive due to lack of population. Mr. Sombreto made another try with Governor Espino and together they went to Manila and there finally was approved by the President. His excellency Diosdado Macapagal. The barangay was registered under the Municipality of Diffun in 1957 but controversy of jurisdiction arises. Later, it was registered in the Municipality of Aglipay in 1958.

The conversion of Sitio Dinait into Barangay Villamor started to turn into progress. Feeder roads were constructed in 1963. The Barrio welcomed improvements of roads with job opportunities for the jobless. Population increase, charcoal industry evolved, furniture shops, buying station, irrigation facilities, upland farms were awarded with stewardship contacts for income of the Barangay. The opening school through the recommendation of the District Supervisor, Juan Cabamban in 1961, now Villamor Elementary School was also paved.

For its political background, Mr. Jacinto Alvarez was the first Barrio Lieutenant, appointed by Mayor Silverio Pascua in 1950. He serves the barrio, 14 years as barrio Lieutenant. In 1964 and election was held where in Mr. Dagdag, a native of Cordon, Isabela won but resigned after six months, Mr. Alberto Sombreto was appointed to carry out the works. He also serve the barrio for 4 years. He resigned in 1968 and Mr. Herminigildo Soriben was appointed as Barrio Lieutenant from 1968-1972. Another election was held where in Barangay Captain Manolo Cristobal won and serve the Barangay from 1980-1988. 1988 election was held wherein all Barangay candidates filed their candidacy as barangay Kagawad and the number 1 Kagawad shall be the chairman of the Barangay where Mr. Manolo Allam garnered number 1 Kagawad. He





serves the barangay from 1980-2002. Mr. Winnie Soriben did not file his candidacy and to take place is Mr. Jimmy B. Laña won over his three opponents on the 2007 election and again on the 2010 election prompting him to serve the barangay from 2007 to June 30, 2018. Hon. Zosimo C. Laungayan was elected as Punong Barangay over his three (3) opponents on the 2018 election and serve the barangay for five (5) years.

In the end, during the October, 2023 election, Hon. Gregggy John S. Dela Peña won as the new Punong Barangay of Barangay Villamor, Cabarroguis, Quirino over his three (3) opponents.

INCOME CLASSIFICATION

Villamor has a total Internal Revenue Allotment of ₱3,954,203.00 and available source of ₱111,000.00 including other external sources, RPT share, fees and charges, and subsidy from the LGU, with the total income of ₱4,065,203.00 of the barangay for the year 2022.

POLITICAL SUBDIVISION

Seven Purok comprises Barangay Villamor. Out of the seven Purok, Purok 1, 4, 5, 6 & 7 possesses wide tract of agricultural land, few of it is rolling And Mountainous and the remaining Purok are almost rolling terrains.

Villamor is one of the Barangay of Cabarroguis that fall within the classified forestland; the Barangay is four (04) kilometre away from the Municipal hall of Cabarroguis, the Capital town of the province

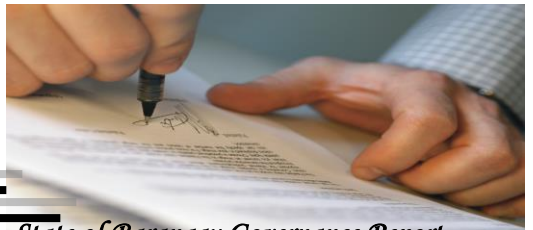
1. Health Facilities- Villamor is lucky to have its own health facilities like Barangay Health Station (BHS) with important health facilities.

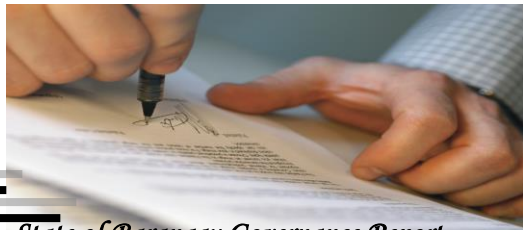

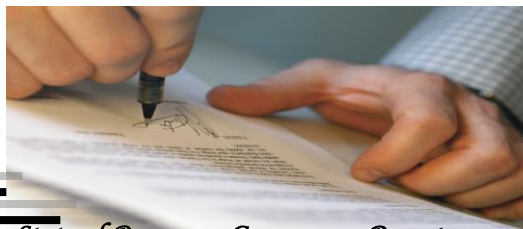
II. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The State of Barangay Governance Report shows that the barangay's overall performance rating is 0.75 or equivalent to 4. The area of Economic Development should be the top priority for development considering that the remark is needs major reinforcement in regard to the barangay compliance to the minimum





requirements of the 1991 Local code and other laws to focus on the service areas of agriculture and fisheries, Entrepreneurship, Business and Industry promotion.

In general, the level of effort which had brought about desirable performance or condition in the areas of Environmental Management has to be sustained.

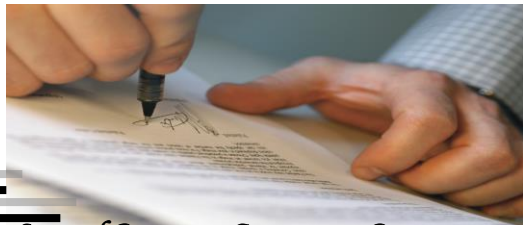
The CY 2023 Budget amounted to ₱4,065,203.00 and beginning balance of 2,406,513.23. The expenditure program was distributed as follows:

The Personal Services had an allotment of ₱1,954,432. Among the sectors, it received the biggest share of 55 % of the total budget.

On the other hand, the total picture of the fund utilization shows that the barangay incurred ₱5,202,248.87 expenses of its budget. Overall, it indicates an ending balance of ₱1,269,467.96.

Significantly, the barangay spent its financial resources hugely on Personal Services, 55 %.

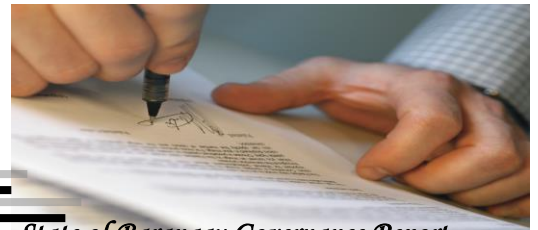

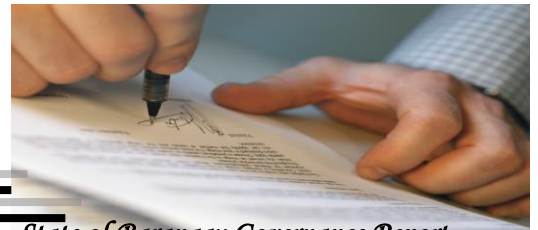

The barangay garnered an overall performance rating of 4 or a remark of compliance to the minimum requirements of the 1991 LGC and other laws;sustain the good practice in the barangay governance. Despite overcoming the rigorous processes in the implementation of the different policies and programs in the barangay, there are still several issues/deficiencies which need necessary improvement:

On Administration, where we have nine (9) service areas, it earned an average performance rating of 0.84 which denotes a performance level of 4. This is attributed to the barangay legislation, transparency,citizen's participation,development planning,revenue code,revenue allocation and utilization, financial accountability,facilities and costumer service and human resource development and management.

On Social Services, we obtained an average rating of 0.82 which indicates of 4 performance level. This is credited to the health and nutrition,education,culture and sports,human and children and public safety and DRRM.

On Economic Development, the barangay got an average rating of 0.49 or a performance level of 2 which needs major reinforcement in the regards to the barangay compliance to the minimum requirement of the LGC of 1991.This attributed to agricultural and fisheries development and Entrepreneurship,Business and Industry Promotion.

Also rated is how the barangay faired in Environmental Management under the Service Areas of Natural Resources Management and Waste Management and Pollution Control where it garnered an average rating of 0.86 with a performance



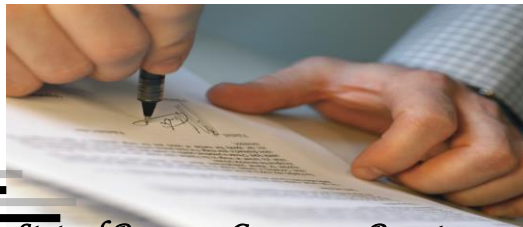

level of 4. This is attributed to the Natural resource management and waste management and pollution control.

V. REPORT FINDINGS

I. ADMINISTRATION

Barangay administration is one of the crucial and essential functions of the barangay. All local government units including the barangay need to undergo self-assessment to measure their performance in terms of delivery of services.

There are nine (9) sub areas which include Local Legislation, Transparency, Citizens' Participation, Development Planning, Revenue Generation, Revenue Allocation and Utilization, Financial Accountability, Facilities and Customer Service, and lastly Human Resource Development and Management.

➤ LOCAL LEGISLATION

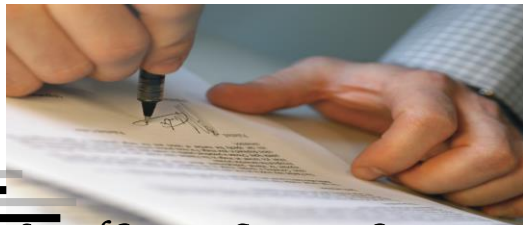
Legislation is the heart of governance. This is the foundation of effective implementation of laws which leads to a better management and development of the LGU.

One of the basic functions/roles of the Sanggunian is the enactment of ordinances and adoption of resolution. This process is called legislation. In order to formulate responsive ordinances/resolutions, there is a need to have proper structure and processes. A monitoring process is needed in order to check the implementation of ordinances.

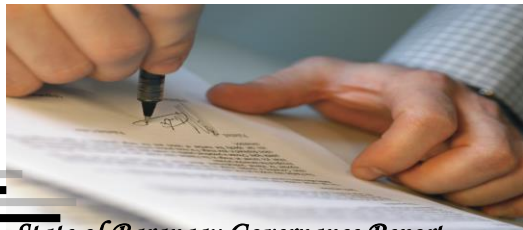

Citizens' participation is one of the important aspects of governance. This is a manifestation that supreme power is lodged to the citizenry.

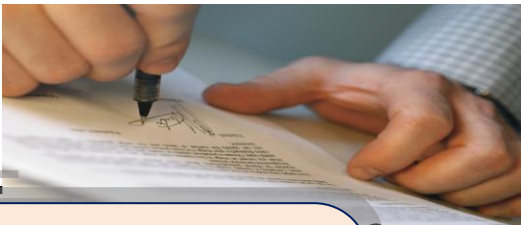

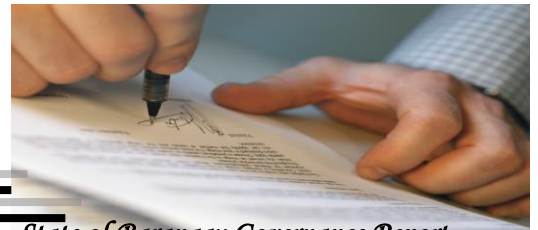


VI. ALTERNATIVE COURSES OF ACTION

Results/data showed our strengths under performance areas of Environmental Management particularly on the service areas of natural resource management and



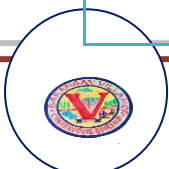


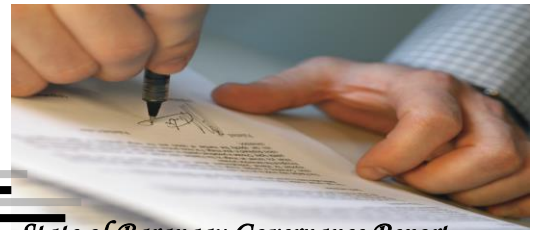

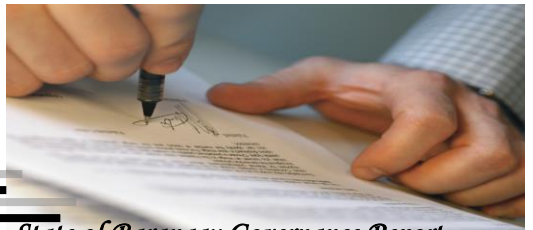

Based on the identified absent indicators, provide actions to address the gaps.

On Administration, Barangay officilas find a way to enact either amended an ordinance for a better implementation of laws. SK chairperson should focus on his programs and activities in order to conduct the mandatory katipinan ng kabataan meeting. Barangay officilas will try to





conduct fund raising activity and generate income barangay economic enterprise.

On social Services, Kasambahay report should be submitted monthly to PESO office. RA 9344 if necessary will be implemented in the barangay to control and prevent negative behavior. Intervention program for CACL and CAR should be created to prevent nor minimize bad habits of children. Regular monthly meeting on BPOC and Lupon members should be strengthen. BPO is being issued if necessary. Contingency plan should be created/constructed as basis and reference in time of disaster.

On Economic Development, barangay officials try to request for the Provision of Post Harvest Facilities through resolution to higher agency (DA/Private Agricultural sector). Adress an advocacy on the organization of Farmer's Cooperatives. BFARMC will be organized if needed and asked for a program for it. Barangay officials try to find an area/location to Installed communal fishponds. Barangay tried to establish barangay economic enterprise if fund is available.

On Environmental Management, barangay official will enact an ordinance/resolution on solid waste management program to continue/sustain good practices of constituents in terms of RA 9003. Tried to create garbage scheme in the barangay for implementation.

Monitoring and evaluation is needed. United in action could be generate or solve those absents/gaps in the barangay as to improve the service or performance of barangay government unit of Barangay Villamor. Some of the indicators are not applicable in the barangay but barangay officials are trying their best to cope up with those gaps found in every service area.



VII. CONCLUSION

Our Barangay Officials are doing their part to promote better governance, we adopted a mechanism to keep track of the barangay's productivity and performance through the Barangay Governance Performance Management System (BGPMS). It is a self assessment tool to measure the capabilities and limitations of the barangay in the delivery of essential public service to the people. Result of this report shall serve as the guiding reference in addressing people's
